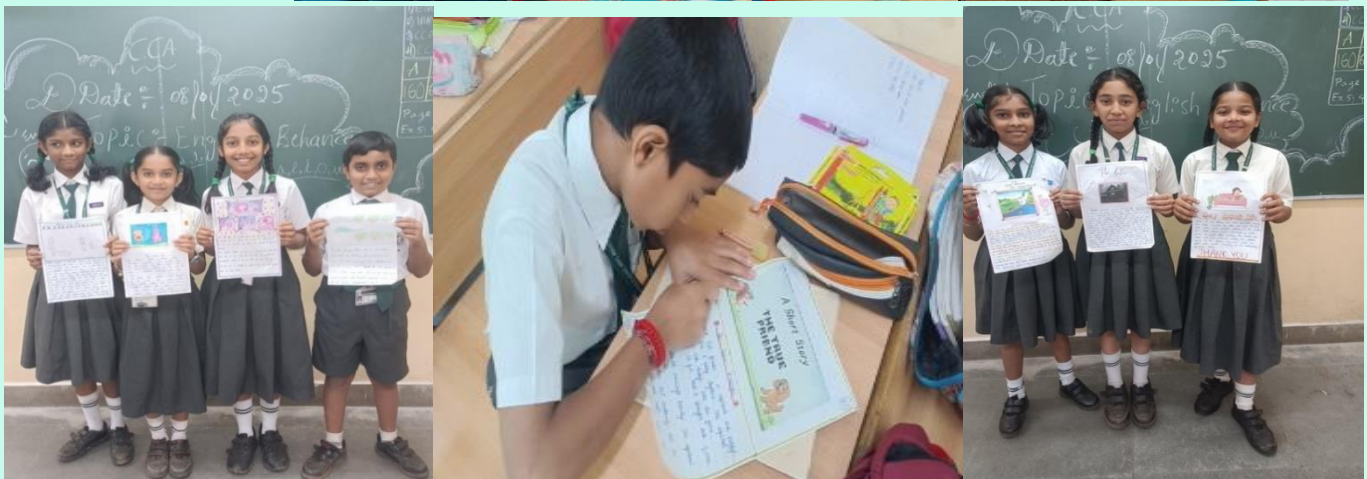

immersive experience not only encouraged students to think creatively and convey the essence of the stories in innovative ways but also deepened their appreciation for India's rich cultural heritage.

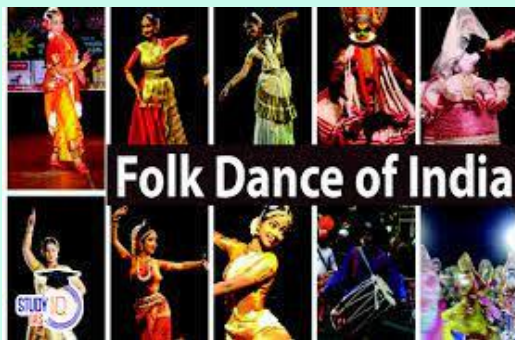
The energy and enthusiasm shown by the students throughout the session were truly commendable, making it an enriching and memorable learning experience for all involved

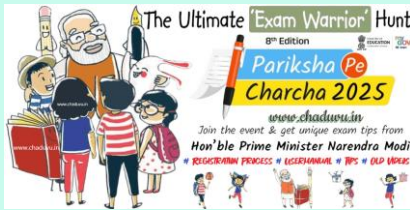


DISTRICT LEVEL CAMPURI
